If you own a vehicle and wish to park in the Beach Patrol Headquarters lot at 109 Talbot Street (Tenants of Tarry A While 6:00 PM – 8:00 AM) or in any Municipal lot you must display a valid parking permit issued by the Beach Patrol. Specific rules and regulations regarding parking will be given to you when you receive the permit.

DO NOT PARK IN THESE AREAS UNTIL YOU RECEIVE A PERMIT

Beach Patrol personnel assigned to work at Headquarters may park in the Beach Patrol parking area located at 109 Talbot Street (enter from Dorchester Street) while working.

Tenants of Tarry A While employee housing may only use the parking area that is located at 109 Talbot Street and is marked for "Official Beach Patrol Parking" between 6:00 PM and 8:00 AM (your vehicle must be removed during the day). This parking area is available on a first come basis and is **NOT** an amenity of the employee housing. This is used for your registered personal vehicle and is not transferable and is not for your visitors. **DO NOT DOUBLE PARK!** Each vehicle must be able to leave the parking area. If this lot is full you **MUST** find another legal parking space for your vehicle.

Municipal parking lots are available during working hours (9:00 AM – 6:00 PM) for working employees only.

If you wish to use either of these parking areas you must complete this form and your request will be reviewed and a parking permit may be issued.
