AMERICAN LEGION HONORS OCPD PFC AARON MORGAN AS OFFICER OF THE YEAR

The American Legion, Sinexpuxent Post #166, Ocean City Maryland held their annual public safety awards ceremony on Monday, September 28, 2009. Amongst their top honors, such as Firefighter of the Year, EMT of the Year, Teacher of the Year and Couple of the Year, the Sinexpuxent Post recognized Ocean City Police Department PFC Aaron Morgan with the prestigious title of Officer of the Year for 2008.

PFC Morgan has had an impressive career in Law Enforcement for such a young officer. His history in police work shows his dedication to protecting and servicing his community.

Before Joining the OCPD, PFC Morgan worked as a Patrolman for the Kennywood Amusement Park in PA, and was an intern with the Allegany County Police in Pittsburgh, PA. He returned as a full time officer to the OCPD in 2006 and since then has been promoted to PFC, become a member of the Traffic Safety Unit, a Field Training Officer and is assigned to the Patrol Division. He has been recognized for his outstanding efforts and hard work. He was recently recognized by MADD for his ability to get Drunk Drivers off of the streets and he is a leading Officer in all statistical categories in the OCPD. In addition, he was one of six officers nominated for the 2008 Neighborhood Watch Officer of the Year.

When he is not on duty, he is often participating in extracurricular activities including School Bus Details, RAAM enforcement, Pedestrian Enforcement, Plain Clothes Enforcement, Window Tinting Enforcement, DUI Patrol, Citizens Police Academy and was an active volunteer in the OCPD Christmas Toy Drive
