OCBP Question-of-the-Week for The Worcester County Times

The newspaper is published on Thursdays; these weekly questions are a new addition for the summer.

Last Week's Question: Lifeguards don't go on duty until May 23rd. Why do I see them running up and down the beach with their buoys at various locations in Ocean City before the 23rd?

The Beach Patrol starts recruiting for the next season at the end of July of the current season and then throughout the following winter. Once a candidate passes the rigorous physical test to become a Surf Rescue Technician (SRT), the Ocean City Beach Patrol provides training for the job during Surf Rescue Academy. The lifeguards you see on the beach during this time are in one of the three training academies that we offer. They are called PSRTs (Probationary Surf Rescue Technicians). They are taught all necessary skills, techniques, procedures and protocols of the Beach Patrol. This is an eight-day, paid (training pay is \$13.25/hr) training program conducted by Beach Patrol instructors with support from other public safety agencies followed by three weeks of supervised, on-the-job probation. All aspects of becoming an SRT are taught during this Surf Rescue Academy. When you see an SRT guarding your beach after May 23rd, you can feel confident that they have been through one of the most rigorous testing and training programs in the nation. Our veteran guards are also required to Drug test, Re-qualify in physical skills and complete re-certification and update training each season.

This Week's Question: I saw a sign advertising jobs for lifeguards in Ocean City and it said. "No Previous Certification or Experience Required" Does that mean anyone can be a lifeguard?

Because of the unique demands of the job, the Beach Patrol does not require or recognize certification or past experience with other agencies. All individuals seeking employment with the Ocean City Beach Patrol must successfully complete all aspects of a pre-employment physical skills evaluation. Testing for the OCBP is offered in Ocean City and at numerous off site locations. Once a candidate passes the physical skills test, they are appointed to a Surf Rescue Academy where they are drug tested before being trained in all aspects of surf rescue and first responder skills. Our veteran guards are also required to drug test, requalify in physical skills and complete recertification,, as well as update their training each season.

TRAINING REMINDER: VICTIM ID



Facing Shore. Most often swimmers and bathers will look eastward at the oncoming waves while in the ocean. In contrast, potential victims will nearly always being facing shore towards safety. For this reason, SRTs should instinctively pay closest attention to those facing shore.

COMMON CAUSES FOR SURF RESCUE INTERVENTION WITH DISTRESSED SWIMMERS

MECHANISM	MOST COMMON	COMMON	OTHER
Rip Current	Stationary swimming, treading or kicking toward shore	Double arm, back stroke in rip.	Abandons floatation device
Age Extreme	Elderly person unable to stand at shoreline or walk against rip current (or tripped by undertow)	Child unable to kick boogie board in to shore	"Trapped" in shorebreak / surf-zone
Long Shore Current	Pulled toward jetty / pier	West current pushing rafts out to sea	Pulled into deeper water from standing

The most common **"missed rescue"** as perceived by beach patrons is not missed at all. Usually it occurs right in front of an SRTs stand with the SRT watching the entire time. An elderly person stumbles by the surf knocked down by the undertow (the subsurface current sweeping back along the sand to the ocean...not a rip current) and is unable to stand on their own, or a child in a small rip being helped in by a nearby parent, etc. These are situations where patrons do not help, but the incidents are not life-threatening and are hardly thought of as "rescues" in the traditional sense. Nevertheless, SRTs should be PROACTIVE, blow two whistles, respond and quickly help that senior to their feet, or call the parent and child to the stand to show that they were aware of the situation and monitoring their safety all along.



ACTIVE DROWNINGS: Identifying Non-Simmers

On a busy summer day, there are potentially hundreds of individuals who cannot swim on each block. Common observations include reliance on floatation devices, over prepared for the water (goggles, mask, aqua shoes, floaties, etc), t-shirt/pants/non-bathing attire in the water, minorities, obese, age extremes , pale or sunburned. These individuals need to be kept close to shore, and watched carefully in the trough where they may step into water above their head.

ROVERS SHOULD BE NOTIFIED OF NON-SWIMMERS IN THE AREA UPON ARRIVING TO AN SRT's STAND!
