Hi Butch-

Just in case you still have Friday meetings, I thought this might be relevant. Last Sunday Ben Carlson, a Newport Beach lifeguard, died while attempting a rescue in California. While this may be an isolated incident, there is a coincidental link between the event trickles and the OCBP. Turns out the his father, Chris Carlson, is a colleague and good friend of mine. He and I had many a conversation about his son the lifeguard. I often related my experiences with the OCBP and all the good that came of it, which I felt made Chris feel more confident that his son was pursuing the right career path. We are all devastated, and one regret is never meeting Ben the Lifeguard.

I intended two points in this email. First, the sea is dominant and can take the strongest of us in an instant. Second, never underestimate the impact that each of your surf technicians has on the local and extended community - not just from the good work they do, but also through the network of the friends, family, and acquaintances over the years. I would not have thought there would be a direct link between someone like Ben Carlson and the OCBP.

Thanks and best for the Captain Craig swim. Sorry I can't make it this year, but I will be following the results.

CPR Refresher Guide

1. Start compressions within 10 seconds of recognition of cardiac arrest

Adult: 30 compressions followed by 2 ventilations <u>2 Person Pediatric:</u> 15 compressions followed by 2 ventilations

- Push hard, push fast: Compress at a rate of at least 100/min with a depth of at least 2 inches (5cm) for adults, approximately 2 inches (5 cm) for children, and approximately 1 ½ inches (4 cm) for infants.
- 3. Allow complete chest recoil after each compression.
- 4. **Minimize interruptions** in compressions (try to limit interruptions to <10 seconds).
- 5. Give effective breaths that make the chest rise.
- 6. Avoid excessive ventilation.

OCBP Question-of-the-Week for The Worcester County Times

<u>This Week's Question</u>: How many lifeguard stands are there from the inlet to the Delaware state line (My kids ask me this all the time, and I used to ask my parents this too years ago, so getting an answer would be great!) Also, how many lifeguards are there in total, and how many does it take to staff the beach on a typical summer day?

The number of stands on the beach changes throughout the season and is dependant on several factors. During the earliest part of our season, Memorial Day weekend through mid-June, while the water is traditionally colder and the crowds are smaller, we place less stands on the beach than we do during peak season July and August. However during our early season we increase the number of guard towers on the weekends and holidays. We also schedule all of our training, certification and re-certification in May and June so that we have all 200+ personnel available once we are in peak season. In support of our early season deployment goals we hold our final Surf Rescue Academy beginning the 3rd week of June each year. With the addition of this last academy of rookies we are at 100% staffing by the end of June. We plan to have all stands in place by July 1st each summer and on a typical day there will be 92 stands deployed from the Ocean City inlet to the Delaware line.

Another annual occurrence is our reduction in staff during the last weeks of August as our personnel return to other obligations. This reduction in personnel is complicated by the earlier start of college classes and the return of our education professionals to school systems throughout the United States. Many of our professional educators are required to return two weeks prior to Labor Day. In recent years we have seen a trend for both colleges and public school systems to begin classes prior to Labor Day. The Ocean City Beach Patrol is committed to provide Surf Rescue Technicians (Lifeguards) along the entire beach for all visitors and residents so rather than have unguarded areas the number of available lifeguard towers are equally distributed along the beach front. During this time of the year you will notice a larger distance between stands. This trend continues following Labor Day through the last day of our season, which is the Sunday of Sunfest weekend (Sunday, September 21, 2014 this year). While we are in a reduced coverage scheme and the redistribution of personnel occurs the location and distance between stands changes (sometimes on a daily basis).

With the addition of returning Surf Rescue Technicians on weekends we will increase the total number of stands (and decrease the distance between stands) on those days.

Although our coverage will be done with fewer personnel and less lifeguard towers than during peak season we will supplement this coverage by increasing the number of Mobil Rescue Units patrolling the beach. These mobile units are first-aid and AED equipped with one SRT (rider) acting as the primary rescue swimmer while the other SRT (driver) maintains radio communication and backup during an emergency. Both are qualified as surf rescue technicians, medical first responders and are quad (ATV) certified.

Now that we have explained how the number of guard towers changes throughout our season, I will attempt to answer the 2nd part of your question regarding how many guards it takes to staff all the stands. Using our maximum deployment of 92 stands it takes a minimum of 109 SRTs to just cover these stands and lunch shifts. However, based on the typical workweek of an SRT which is 5 ½ days it takes additional SRTs to cover days off, special duties, and training. To accommodate this the Ocean City Beach Patrol is organized by crews. The 17 crews are deployed from the Ocean City inlet to the Maryland/Delaware line and cover all 10 miles of beach and ocean. Each crew is made up of eight or nine SRTs, one of which is the crew chief and one is appointed to the one season training position of assistant crew chief. Typically each stand is assigned a "regular" guard who sits that stand five days each week. During their half day they are known as the lunch rover and replace an SRT in their crew for 30 minutes during that crew's lunch rotation. During their two days off their stand one of the crew's rovers will cover their stand. In addition to the SRTs the Beach Patrol also employs surf

beach facilitators who monitor the daily surfing beaches as well as office staff. The leadership of the patrol is made up of one Captain, one 1st Lieutenant, two 2nd Lieutenants, and twelve sergeants. The one leadership position you are most likely to notice is our area supervisors (sergeants) who patrol one of 4 areas along the beach on Honda 4x4s.

Meet the Lifeguard: Crew Chief Liz VanderClute

Crew Chief Liz Vander Clute, a native of Ocean City, has been with the Beach Patrol for eight years. She is in charge of Crew 2, which covers the beach from North Division Street to 5th Street. Communications Procedures for OCBP

Effective: Monday, 14 July 2014 Concludes: Tuesday, 19 August 2014

Starting on Monday, July 14, 2014, (today), OCBP will be assigning an additional Beach Patrol sergeant to the Public Safety Building located at 65th St. This is a daily assignment functioning as the dispatcher for all Beach Patrol related needs. This dispatcher, answering as "Ocean City," will be picking up the bulk of the dispatching role that was previously handled by the Beach Patrol Duty Officer.

To be clear, anything operational in nature should be communicated on OCBP1. Messages on OCBP1 should be short and concise. Anything administrative, such as assignments, equipment, stand repair, coordination, etc., should be communicated on OCBP2.

"Ocean City" will handle the following events on OCBP1:

- Any radio equipped unit going <u>in service</u> and <u>out of service</u>, or the changing of status and assignment. Think in terms of anyone with a radio: Officer, Stand Radio, Surfing Beach, JBP, Vehicle, Quad, Jetski, etc.
- Roll call at 10:00.
- Any inter-agency interaction. (OCPD, FIRE, EMS, NRP, USCG, Public Works, etc.).
 - "Commander to Ocean City: Dispatch EMS to 12th St. for a neck/back; stand by for patient information; I am enroute."
- Lost and found individuals.
 - o "80 to Ocean City: Found boy on 82." "Go ahead." "Found boy on 82 Charles, 5, green."
- Lost/found property identified with a name that needs to be picked up by OCPD.
- Wheelchairs
 - "Plaza to Ocean City: Wheelchair at 94th St. in service."
- Logging all water rescues. At the first available and/or appropriate break in action after the rescue, the radio operator will call and say,
 - o "(Radio location) to Ocean City: 2 victims retrieved."

During any incident, use the phraseology enroute, on scene, and clear scene, to indicate your status.

"Beach Patrol" will handle the following events. If the message is operational in nature and brief, use OCBP1. If it is administrative (scheduling, etc.), use OCBP2.

- Handle individual personnel in and out of service (SBF's at 10:00hrs and 16:30hrs, lunch rovers, late arrivals at 13:00).
- Assign and issue incident numbers.
- Manage personnel issues.
- Handle lost/found property that is not able to be identified with a name
- Scheduling & Stand placement
- Give the next day's assignments on OCBP2.
- Coordinate rover coverage.

Because of the way information is entered into CAD, please use the following order:

Unit, nature, and then location. Give us this information in this order every time!

So when contacting Ocean City say, "38th to Ocean City: Lost boy on 41," then wait for the go ahead. This lets the individual dispatcher set up the card, and then get ready to enter your comments.
