OCBP Question of the Week for The Worcester County Times

I heard a lifeguard telling a friend that the OCBP was still testing for lifeguards for this summer and they didn't need to be certified because the Beach Patrol certifies them during a paid Surf Rescue Training Academy. What does testing mean and what can I expect if I pass the test?

Because of the unique demands of the job, the Beach Patrol does not require or recognize certification or past experience with other agencies. All individuals seeking employment with the Ocean City Beach Patrol must successfully complete all aspects of a 10-phase pre-employment physical skills evaluation. Testing for the OCBP is offered in Ocean City and at select off-site locations during our off season (Feb – Apr). Once a candidate passes the physical skills test and a personal interview, he/she is appointed to a paid (\$15.25 per hour) Surf Rescue Academy. The academy is 68 hours of training including physical skills, classroom instruction and on the job training with a supervisor. Training consists of all aspects of surf rescue and medical first responder skills. After passing a mandatory drug test and successfully completing Surf Rescue Academy, rookie Surf Rescue Technicians are assigned 3 weeks of supervised probation on a stand (with a written review each week) where additional training will take place.

The next on-site test in Ocean City will be May 30th. If interested please register on-line and check-in beginning at 9 A.M. at Dorchester Street on the Boardwalk. It is important that anyone hoping to secure a position for 2020, try-out this Saturday May 30th and be prepared to attend Surf Rescue academy starting on June 14, 2020. If you are interested in an adventure with the Ocean City Beach Patrol as a Surf Rescue Technician for the summer of 2021, we will begin holding Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluations in August. Visit our website or talk with a Surf Rescue Technician (lifeguard) on your beach.

With a national lifeguard shortage, we work year-round to assure that we have 100% of our positions filled each year. Many other local governments and beach patrols have to close pools, close beaches or reduce coverage during transition times both in opening up the season and closing down the season. This is due to the fact that most of the lifeguards are still in school or have jobs in a school system.

We encourage anyone interested in becoming a Surf Rescue Technician (lifeguard) to speak to the lifeguard on your beach, go to our website or contact Beach Patrol Head Quarters (410- 289-7556) and register for a specific testing opportunity. 
