Good Morning Mr. Arbin,

I am writing this email to express my sincere gratitude for the Surf Rescue Technicians who came to my daughter's aid last week. My daughter Angelica was enjoying a typical day at the beach, catching waves on her boogie board while I followed her along the shoreline. Typically, I'm in the water with her but it was a bit too chilly for me that day. As I watched her drift further and further to the right, a friendly Surf Rescue Technician approached me to warn me that the water in that area was deep and dangerous due to a rip current. She immediately offered to go in and get Angelica. I said "yes" and followed her in. She swam confidently to my daughter as I waded in further to also get to her. Although I knew it was dangerous, as a mother I felt the need to go in as well. She reached Angelica quickly and my fear began to subside. However, I was uncomfortable going back to shore until I was sure she was out of the deeper area. That is when a second Surf Rescue Technician appeared close to me and instructed me to grab on to his float. I hesitated, continuing to look back to Angelica and the first technician. He communicated to me that he "trusted his guard." Ultimately, everyone made it out of the water quickly and safely.

Although Angelica was not aware of the dire situation she was in, I know that the intervention of the guards was lifesaving. I called the Ocean City, MD government office the next day to try and find out who the technician was so that we could formally thank her. I was given your contact information instead. Would you please pass on my biggest thanks and gratitude to this young lady and the team for what they do each day for the public?

Here are the details, I hope they help you to identify the team who helped us.

Incident Date: Sunday June 7th (between 2 and 3pm)
Location: Beach area in front of Holiday Inn (17th Street)
Technician Description: Young, blond, female and young, darker haired, male.
Angelica's Description: 7 year old African American female on a boogie board

New ACC's

If this is the 1st time you are eligible to be Mobile Rescue Unit (ATV) certified, you will need to provide a copy of your driving record. It DOES NOT need to be certified; the cheap one will do. You are also committing to completing SRT III certification (required for CC)

Re-certifications

If you are a Maryland driver, your updated driving record has been obtained. If you are not a MD driver, YOU need to provide it.

People who are currently certified will remain certified (if we have a driving record) until the final re-cert. If you attend a re-cert it will be renewed until next season's class.

Officers

You need to attend a re-cert as an instructor so we can include your name as part of re-cert.

OCBP Question of the Week for The Worcester County Times

This Week's Question: I notice the lifeguards make everybody get out of the ocean before they leave, but people go back in after the lifeguard is off the beach. Why is that?

The beach patrol has known of, or been involved with dozens of drownings and near drownings that have occurred outside our 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. "duty" hours. Over 97 percent of all water-related deaths in Ocean City in the past 90 years have occurred while the Ocean City Beach Patrol is off duty. The single, strongest message that we try to impress on people is that they should stay out of the ocean when lifeguards are not on duty. Many times we have been involved in cases where, if this simple rule had been followed, lives and families would not have been impacted by such a preventable tragedy. Clearing the water at the end of our shift may seem routine, but we never take the goal of this policy lightly. Before we started the policy of clearing the water of swimmers at 5:25 p.m., it was very possible that a swimmer could have entered the water while guards were on duty, only to turn around and find the stands empty and pulled back for the night. In most cases this would not be a problem. However, if the swimmer were to become caught in a rip current or experienced a medical emergency, the situation could quickly take a tragic turn, despite their intentions to swim only under the watchful eyes of the beach patrol. In contrast, by pulling everyone out of the ocean before we leave the beach, we know that those who enter the water during unguarded hours are taking that risk knowingly. The risk is great, although many of the 2,000 – 4,000 people who we rescue during guarding hours tell us that they never intended to go out that "far", they do not make the connection to the fact that rip currents (the 3rd leading cause of weather related deaths nationally) will actually pull a person from waist deep water to water that is over their head quickly and without warning. These same currents that are the cause of 95% of all rescues we make during the day are also present before and after we are on our stands. The only difference is that when a person finds themselves in trouble before 10:00 AM or after 5:30 PM. there is no one to save their life and unfortunately it all too often has ended in tragedy. We continue our efforts to educate the public, warning them of the dangers of swimming on unguarded beaches, and that we make sure people leave the ocean before we pull our lifeguard stands back and cross over the dune for the night. Although we do not "guard" the beach before 10:00 or after 5:30, we do have a small number of "mobile" patrols standing by should we receive a 911 call for a swimmer in distress from 8:00 AM till 8:00 PM. Having these trained and equipped, mobile rescue units already deployed saves valuable minutes in responding to someone who made the "POOR" decision to swim without a "lifeguard" and has found themselves in a life threatening situation. There are quite a few "lucky" individuals who are alive today because of these "extended" patrols. Just don't let it be you! And whatever you do, it is very important to remember, if you see someone in trouble in the ocean, do not attempt a swimming rescue, call 911 and remain on the scene until help arrives. Attempting a rescue usually adds an additional victim and you are best to be able to provide accurate information once help arrives.

Hence our slogan, "Keep your feet in the sand until the lifeguard's in the stand." Heeding this simple warning could save a life, yours!

Lifeguards always get questions asking about sharks and what if any danger the pose. This concern is always greatest when the Discovery Channel has its annual "Shark Week", or as shark instances have been reported in the news recently. Yet many of these same individuals who seem to be concerned for their family's safety will swim or allow their children to swim when lifeguards are not on duty. But in reality there is no danger from sharks in Ocean City, but RIP currents are the real life and death situation. So do your part and don't go in the ocean if we are not on duty and pass this lifesaving information onto anyone that you care about.

Meet the Lifeguard: CC Greg Gordon

The lifeguards of the Ocean City Beach Patrol are glad to answer any of your beach and water safety questions. Greg Gordon has been with the Beach Patrol for 4 years. He is the Crew Chief for Crew 1 and sits the stand just south of the Ocean City Pier in an area we call the Inlet beach. His crew of eight Surf Rescue Technicians is responsible for all water and beach safety from the rocks at the North Inlet jetty to Talbot Street. Crew 1 has two very unique challenges that do not exist anywhere else along the 10 miles of Ocean City's guarded beaches. The Ocean City Inlet and North Jetty with their strong currents, as well as having the only oceanside fishing pier, provide both a challenge for Crew 1 as well as the perfect training location for our Surf Rescue Academies and Junior Beach Patrol Program.

Greg is active with competitions and was in crew 6 last summer; his crew won the crew competition. For recreation Greg likes surfing, cycling, and lifting weights. In the off season Greg attends the University of Maryland, College Park, studying for a bachelor's of science in Kinesiology. He is also a certified personal trainer and works for UMD's Recreation and Wellness Department. CC Greg Gordon and the other lifeguards of the Ocean City Beach Patrol are glad to answer any of your beach and water safety questions.
