

OCBP ALUMNI ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

As part of it's mission to support the Ocean City Beach Patrol and the guards who serve, the OCBP Alumni Association announces it's **Second Annual Scholarship Challenge**. The prize: a one time **\$500 College Scholarship** award to a current OCBP SRT.

Who is eligible?

The Challenge is open to any current OCBP SRT in good standing, who is enrolled in or entering a 2 or 4 year college in the Fall of 2020. Applicants must be registered for classes.

What is the Challenge?

A 500 word essay on the topic: "How has saving the lives of others ended up changing yours?" (450 minimum / 550 maximum.)

How do you submit your essay?

Essays are to be emailed as a .pdf file to Ward Kovacs (wkovacs@oceancitymd.gov). Title your file using your birthday as the code. For instance, if you were born on July 4, 2001 you would title the file "07042001". This is meant to avoid favoritism. Make sure in your email that Ward knows who you are.

What are the judges looking for in an essay?

A thoughtful examination of what life on the OCBP and saving the lives of others has meant to you. Essays will be judged on Ideas, Presentation, Grammar and Spelling. Plagiarism will result in automatic disqualification.

What are the important dates to know for the challenge?

All submissions are due before midnight August 7, 2020.

The winning essay will be announced August 14, 2020.

The Scholarship prize will be issued immediately afterwards.

Pick up the MVA form VR-124 from Captain Arbin. Fill out form completely.


Attach a check made payable to the Ocean City Beach Patrol Surf Rescue Association (OCBPSRA) for \$50.00. This is a one-time fee and will not be charged again.

If you are requesting a specific number, make sure it is still available.

Return form to Beach Patrol Headquarters. Do not send or take to MVA—the form needs an authorizing signature to process.

Once the VR-124 form and check have been received, it takes 4-6 weeks to receive the tags. They will be mailed to the address on your registration. In the future, you will receive the regular tag renewal application directly from the MVA every 2 years

Please Note the Following Policies:

Specific Beach Patrol Policy on Hazing

Hazing or any type of Initiation ritual is strongly prohibited and will result in immediate discipline up to and including discharge. These behaviors are defined as any action taken or any situation created intentionally that causes embarrassment, harassment or ridicule and risks emotional and/or physical harm to members of a group or crew, whether new or not, regardless of the person's willingness to participate.

Town of Ocean City - EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK -Section 3.15

Other relationships may develop between employees (i.e. engagement), which may present a potential for conflict of interest. These employees are expected to identify those relationships and contact the Human Resources Director for a determination as to whether the relationship presents a potential conflict, and whether the provisions of this section should apply. In cases of positional authority (in a position of responsibility to supervise and evaluate an employee) you must immediately inform the Officer In Charge of the relationship and avoid any potential conflicts.

Daily Wellness Checks

All Town of Ocean City Employees are required to perform a wellness check prior to the start of their assigned shift. This order was enacted per the City Manager and Risk Manager, with this daily requirement beginning on March 24, 2020. Beach Patrol employees may complete the required wellness check online between 6:00 AM and 9:45 AM. The daily wellness check is audited each day to assure compliance. Beginning on Monday, June 22nd we began recording any missed wellness checks by an employee, after one month of monitoring with no penalty. To assure that each employee is being responsible, after three wellness checks are missed, an employee incident is initiated. If two more misses are recorded a second employee incident is generated and will result in a conference. Additional missed checks may result in suspension or termination.

OCBP Question-of-the-Week for The Worcester County Times

<u>This Week's Question</u>: I heard a lifeguard telling a friend that the OCBP has already started to test for lifeguards for next summer (2021). Why are you testing now for next year? When are these tests being held? What does testing mean and what certifications do I need ?

Because of the unique demands of the job, the Beach Patrol does not require or recognize certification or past experience with other agencies. All individuals seeking employment with the Ocean City Beach Patrol must successfully complete all aspects of a 10 phase pre-employment physical skills evaluation (PEPSE). Testing for the OCBP is offered in Ocean City and at select off-site locations during our off-season if needed. Once a candidate passes the physical skills test and a personal interview, he/she is appointed to a paid (\$15.25 per hour) Surf Rescue Training Academy. We hold two Surf Rescue Training Academies each season to accommodate individual needs the first begins on Sunday, May 23, 2021 with a second academy beginning Sunday, June 20th. After passing a mandatory drug test, Surf Rescue Academy is an eight (8) consecutive day (67 hour) Training program comprised of both physical skill training and development as well as classroom based trainings, certifications and "On the Job Training". Following the successful completion of Surf Rescue Academy, rookie Surf Rescue Technicians are assigned 3 weeks of on the stand supervised probation in a crew to continue instruction in all aspects of surf rescue and first responder skills, with a written review each week. Once the probationary period is completed the rookie will be recognized as a Surf Rescue Technician and receive an incentive reward.

We have 4 Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluations (testing) scheduled this August starting on Saturday, August 1st. The final onsite testing will take place on Saturday, August 15th in Ocean City, before we begin our off-site testing after the new year. If you are interested please register on-line and check-in beginning at 9 A.M. at Dorchester Street on the Boardwalk. Because we have such a high return rate from one season to the next, it is important that anyone hoping to secure a position for 2021 try-out as soon as possible Although we have scheduled testing through June 2021, we attempt to fill all anticipated openings as soon as possible and may not need to hold any testing after September. Therefore, testing may be suspended at any time.

The reason we begin testing now is to take advantage of the great ocean conditions (warmer water) while recruiting those individuals who have spent a summer living and working in Ocean City but were under a misconception that they did not have the necessary credentials to seek employment as an ocean lifeguard. In past summers these tests were a great opportunity for our visiting J-1 students to secure a job with the Patrol for the following summer. Unfortunately there are very few J-1 students working in Ocean City this summer due to Covid-19. As seasonal workers and visitors have met Surf Rescue Technicians who are currently working for us over the summer, they come to realize that we provide paid training (\$15.25 per hour) and certifications in Surf Rescue Academy and working as a Surf Rescue Technician is a possibility for them to have a job that makes a difference. Each candidate is required to pass all phases of the Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluation which includes a personal interview and receive a recommendation from the evaluation team to receive an appointment to a Surf Rescue Training Academy. These potential recruits have already spent one summer in Ocean City and are familiar with the area and have already solved the problem of securing seasonal housing. Therefore, when they accept an appointment to a Surf Rescue Academy they are most likely to follow through and actually accept the position the following season (we lose a few recruits each year to personal logistical concerns).

A major reason that we also start testing a year ahead is that we want to have the opportunity to attract and hire the best. With a national lifeguard shortage, we work year round to assure that we have 100% of our positions filled each year, while many other local governments and beach patrols have to close pools, close beaches or reduce coverage.

We encourage anyone interested in becoming a Surf Rescue Technician (lifeguard) to speak to the lifeguard on your beach, go to our website or contact Beach Patrol Head Quarters (410- 289-7556) and register for a specific testing opportunity.
