Ocean City Reveals New Destination Brand:

Somewhere to smile about.

The Department of Tourism and Business Development is excited to announce the new Brand after working on brand development and creation for the last 18 months. In partnership with the agency of record, BVK, staff members began an in-depth discovery process in August 2021 to identify and cultivate a clear brand identity.

At that time, more than 100,000 surveys were distributed in hopes of collecting information from residents, visitors, business owners, meeting planners, and non-visitors. The department collected 5,200 completed survey results, conducted several stakeholder focus groups, and interviewed hundreds of people to identify and develop an authentic brand positioning platform and an evident brand personality.

This feedback was used to inform and develop a Value-Based Positioning model for Ocean City. The core value of "Carefree" was identified as the essence of the Brand. From there, BVK and OC partnered to identify and develop a clear brand identity

that is true to the destination's history and aspirational future.

The team also strategically analyzed and examined Ocean City's competitors brand positions like Virginia Beach, New Jersey Beaches, Myrtle Beach, The Outer Banks, Delaware Beaches, and The Wildwoods. The team uncovered, through this research, combined with the perception study results, the opportunity to take Ocean City's core values and lean into the sense of place our visitors have while in Ocean City.

The department found that Ocean City was not just simply a destination for people to visit, but a destination that evokes a carefree feeling people seek when choosing a vacation spot to visit. In other words, visitors described Ocean City's personality as "energetic" and "approachable," with a foundation built on a tradition that is also evolving with modern appeals. These pages of research findings helped Ocean City create a robust brand framework that led to a new Brand

platform: "Somewhere to Smile About."

"We believe our new brand identity leverages historical strengths, distinctive equities, and a culturally relevant vibe to position OC for success with growing our target audiences," commented Ocean City Mayor Rick Meehan. "Our extensive research shows that Ocean City is a "happy place" for both our residents and our visitors. And what is the universal symbol of happiness? A smile."

A smile, after all, is a universal sign of joy. A joy that can be felt in Ocean City's new smile logo and "Somewhere to Smile About" Brand. The carefree logo transcends language and is positively contagious; creating a recognizable symbol that reminds Ocean City customers of the happy feeling they have when visiting.

A sense of weight lifted. Lighthearted and bright. Warm and approachable. Outgoing. Effortless. Not too serious. The new Brand is playful, and easygoing and gives our visitors something (and somewhere) to smile about.

Downtown Recreation Complex Soon To Begin Redesign

After nearly a year of delays, the Downtown Recreation Complex (DRC), a two-block park area adjacent to the bay between 3rd and 4th Streets, will soon see some of its new design concepts become realities. The west block, closest to the water, will close to the public this spring for work to begin on the infrastructure of



the reimagined space. The infrastructure work is expected to include property elevation, improved bayside boardwalk access, the addition of head-in parking along 4th Street, as well as the installation of walking paths, benches, a new playground, and increased security measures.

Work on the east-block of the complex is expected to include an expansion of the Ocean Bowl Skate Park, the installation of a new multi-court surface for both tennis and pickleball play, reconstruction of the basketball courts, and the addition of a new public restroom. As the east block construction schedule, including the skate park closure dates, have not yet been determined as of this printing, the community is asked to contact the Recreation & Parks Department at 410-250-0125 for operational updates. With an overall park re-opening tentatively scheduled for summer 2024, the newly refreshed DRC is sure to be the focal point of the downtown area and will provide both a welcoming feel and increased usability for the community.

Boardwalk Receives New Deck Boards ___

Ocean City's iconic 2.25 mile long Boardwalk has been undergoing a major facelift. The constant exposure to sun and salt spray, maintenance vehicles, trams, and several million visitors every year, means these boards only last ten years before they need replacement.

From October 2021 to May 2022, the first half of the project was completed replacing all the boardwalk deck boards from 27th to 15th Street as well as the south end of the Boardwalk from the Life-Saving Station Museum to the north side of the pier. This past winter, deck boards have been replaced from the pier to 15th Street. At the time of this publication, completion of the project is expected to be early April.

Meet Therapy Dog, MAX!

The Ocean City Fire Department has welcomed K-9 Max, a 2-year-old Labrador Retriever, who has special skills and training to help first-responders and members of the Ocean City Community after traumatic events. Therapy dogs have been shown to have a positive impact on the mental and emotional well-being of individuals. Max has received over 18 months of advanced training by Hero-Dogs and he is highly motivated by contact with people, affectionate, of moderate-to-low energy and drive, and calm and quiet indoors. Max is house trained, has good manners, extensive obedience training, and a large repertoire of specialized skills that can be used for the benefit of all Town Employees.

Walk Smart, Drive Smart, and Bike Smart to Enjoy Everything Ocean City has to Offer

Your full attention is needed when navigating through Ocean City whether on foot, bicycle, or in a vehicle. It is imperative to be free from distractions like mobile devices and earbuds. Cheswick and the OC Walk Smart, Drive Smart, Bike Smart campaign focus on helping residents and visitors reach their destination safely and stay safe while in Ocean City.

Cheswick reminds pedestrians to Walk Smart with the following tips:

- Press the crosswalk button before crossing Coastal Highway.
- Cross at and within marked crosswalks.
- Look, pay attention, then cross.
- Follow all traffic signal signs and lane markings.
- Make eve contact and be seen by drivers.

Cheswick reminds drivers to Drive Smart:

- Drive sober: Never drive a vehicle while impaired by alcohol
- Stop for pedestrians at crosswalks. It's the law in Maryland.
- Slow down. Watch for pedestrians and yield to pedestrians. especially when turning.
- Keep your eyes on the road.
- Avoid all distractions. It's illegal to text and use hand-held devices while driving.
- Share the road with bicyclists and give 3 feet of space when passing.
- Check your rearview and/or side mirror for bikes in the bike lane before turning right.
- · Avoid driving in bus lanes.

Cheswick also reminds bicyclists to Bike Smart:

- Stop at all red lights and stop signs.
- Ride in the direction of traffic flow.
- Do not ride on the sidewalk. It's illegal and dangerous.
- Ride sober. Never ride a bicycle while impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- Avoid distractions and pay attention.
- Use bike lights if riding after dark.

Free Internet Available for Qualifying Families

Low income households (Medicaid, SNAP, Free & Reduced Lunch, Pell Grant recipients, Supplemental Socials Security WIC, and more) are eligible for free high-speed Internet with the federal Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) and Internet Essentials. The Affordable Connectivity Program will cover the monthly price of home Internet so there is no cost to households that enroll in Internet Essentials or Internet Essentials Plus. Guide to Parking in OC

Enjoy premium parking in downtown OC. The Inlet Lot and downtown municipal lots and side streets are well-lit. conveniently-located and budget-friendly. There's no need to display your receipt on the dashboard, just park, pay and play! See the rates and details provided in this section.

ParkMobile

Let Parkmobile® handle all the payment details.

Simply download the app, enter your license plate number and payment information, start a new parking session then relax and have fun! You will receive an alert if your time is about to expire so you can add more time to your parking session through the app. It will even store your data for future use.

Rather pay at a kiosk?

No problem. All kiosks accept dollar bills and credit cards and a few specially-marked kiosks accept quarters as well. Before you leave your vehicle, write down or take a snapshot of your license plate number, estimate your length of stay, then head for the nearest kiosk. Please, take your time and follow the on-screen instructions and carefully enter the requested information. Inaccurate or incomplete data may result in additional charges and fines.

Want to extend your parking session?

Yay! That means you're having fun! If you're parking in the INLET LOT, just pay the remaining balance before your vehicle exits the lot. If you're parked on a SIDE STREET or in a MUNICIPAL LOT, no need to run back to your car, just go to the nearest kiosk (Inlet Lot kiosk excluded), enter your license plate number and pay for additional time.

Your first 30 minutes are free, including handicapped! Patrons must pay for expired time prior to leaving the Inlet Lot to avoid being billed for additional administrative costs.

Please read this important information about parking in the Inlet Parking Lot. The Inlet Lot is camera-enforced and only records your license plate information, your time in, and time out of the lot. This system matches its data with the information you provide in the Parkmobile® app or kiosk. If you provide incomplete or inaccurate data, the system will automatically generate and mail an invoice to the vehicle's registered owner with charges equal to the time spent in the lot times the hourly rate plus a non-negotiable \$25.00 processing fee.

OCEAN CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT **Ordinance Reminders**

The Ocean City Police Department is reminding residents and visitors that safety in our resort town is our number one priority. Our ordinances are designed to provide a pleasurable, safe & fun vacation, along with a livable community for our residents.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed in public. This includes any street, avenue, alley, sidewalk, Boardwalk, parking lot, on the beach or in any vehicle. Possessing an open container of any alcoholic beverage in public is prohibited.

Bikes. Skateboards. & Electric Bikes on the Boardwalk: Bikes, skateboards, & class 1 electric bikes are permitted on the Boardwalk from Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend - Labor Day, between 2 a.m. to 12 p.m. Class 2 & 3 electric bikes and hoverboards are not allowed on the Boardwalk at any time.

Fresh Air, Clean Beach: To help keep our beaches clean & our air fresh, OC is proud to offer a smokefree Boardwalk and designated smoking areas on the beach. Designed to accommodate both smokers & non-smokers, OC's restricted smoking policy provides designated smoking areas on the beach; however, prohibits smoking & vaping on the Boardwalk & beach access ways, beach & dune crossings, parks & covered bus shelters. Voluntary compliance is expected; however, citations for violations may be issued by officers if necessary.

Pets on the Beach & Boardwalk: Pets are not permitted on the beach or Boardwalk May 1 -September 30.

Grilling & Open Fires: Grilling is prohibited on public property except at designated park grill locations leased for private usage. Open fires are prohibited on public property, except in limited beach locations with a permit from the Fire Marshal's Office. More information can be found at ocbonfires.com.



Due to the large crowds that visit OC during the summer months, surfing is not permitted between 10am–5:30pm. However, a few blocks each day are set apart as daily surfing beaches. There is also a surfing beach located at the Inlet Mon–Fri. No swimming or wading is permitted at the surfing beaches & all surfers must wear ankle leashes. Surfing beach limits are established using the yellow stands. In addition, signs & flags are used to highlight the area. Surfing beaches rotate each day. **The daily surfing beach schedule is available at ococean.com/ocbp.** Surfing beach facilitators are beach patrol members who maintain the surfing beach area & wear yellow uniforms so they are not confused with SRTs (Surf Rescue Technicians). On days of inclement weather, you can ask any SRT on the beach if the surfing ordinance has been modified, or call OCBP headquarters at 410.289.7556.



TOWN OF OCEAN CITY, MARYLAND **License Requirements**

RENTAL LICENSE: If you rent your property to anyone, for any length of time, the law requires you to first obtain an annual Ocean City rental license. and an Ocean City noise control permit. Online rentals must also comply. Maintaining a positive resident and visitor experience is important to everyone. Compliance with the laws, ordinances and regulations within the Town of Ocean City and State of Maryland ensure safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units. Rental applications may be obtained at City Hall, on the website or by contacting 410.289.8833 (https://oceancitymd.gov/ oc/departments/finance/new-licenses/)

R-1 Zoning: Properties located within the R-1 single family residential zoning district must meet occupancy criteria limited to no more than 4 unrelated people. Please contact the Department of Planning and Community Development for a pre-season inspection of your property to confirm compliance with building and fire codes and to determine maximum occupancy permitted. 410.289.8855.

REMINDER: Properties that may be in violation of

rental licenses or a safety, building or health code should be reported to the Ocean City Property Review and Enforcement Strategies for Safehousing (P.R.E.S.S.) Committee at 410.289.8855. Also the "Key to Successful New Construction or Home Renovation Projects is to Call BEFORE You Start!" From big to small projects and property improvements (decks, sheds, floating docks and landscaping), the Department of Planning and Community Development is ready to provide information to get you started. The Town offers Beach Wheelchairs for patrons unable to walk across the sand. Beach wheelchairs are available on a first-come, first-serve basis at certain locations, between Memorial Day and Labor Day. Call 410.520.5231 – 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. to get a beach wheelchair box unlocked.

This free service is monitored by the Town's Beach Patrol staff. Please remember that our Beach Patrol is here primarily to provide safety services to our beach-goers; therefore, other beach-related responsibilities may cause a delay in staff attending to the distribution and collection of beach wheelchairs.

- For access to a chair, to get a wheelchair box unlocked or to report damage or problems with a chair, see a lifeguard or call 410.520.5231, 10am-4pm.
- Be prepared to show your driver's license & complete wheelchair permit & waiver.
- Use chair only on beach/sand & within 1 block of the wheelchair box.
- Use at your own risk. Do not put chair in water. Do not inflate or deflate tire air pressure.
- Return beach wheelchair to lifeguard after transferring to another chair so that it may be available to others.

A limited number of chairs may be reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis.

The Mounted Unit was formed in the late '80s and as of today consists of five horses (Benson, Moose, Storm, Major and Riptide). You can find the horses throughout town during the year and primarily on the Boardwalk during the summer months for crowd control. OCEAN CITY FLOOD HAZARD PROTECTION | April is Maryland Flood Awareness Month

All property in Ocean City is in a flood hazard area & subject to flooding from the ocean, coastal bays & heavy rainfall. Minor flooding is not uncommon & major flooding happens occasionally. FEMA places properties in flood zones based on their chance of flooding. Property owners can find their property's flood hazard designation by contacting the Department of Planning & Community Development, 410.289.8855, bneville@oceancitymd.gov, or the City Engineer, 410.289.8790, pmauser@oceancitymd.gov.

Natural & Beneficial Functions of Floodplains: Floodplains in their natural state provide many beneficial functions. Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in OC are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking on them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function. Bayside, wetlands & other open spaces act as sponges, storing floodwaters before they reach upland areas. These natural areas are protected by Federal, State & Local regulations.

Flood Warning System: OC has developed a flood warning system as part of our Comprehensive Operations Plan. Since flooding here is caused by storms & hurricanes, the warning system is based on storm severity & location. Protect family from flooding hazards. Establish a family rendezvous location when the warning is issued.

Flood Insurance: Standard homeowners insurance policies do not cover losses due to flooding. OC participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, which makes federally backed flood insurance available to property owners. This insurance is required in many cases, such as when property is purchased with a federally backed mortgage. Property owners can insure buildings & contents against flood damage & renters can insure possessions. Condominiums should carry a flood insurance policy on the structure itself. Flood insurance is available to all property owners & renters. Consider a Preferred Risk Flood Insurance Policy. The NFIP's Preferred Risk Policy, or PRP, offers low-cost flood insurance to owners & tenants of eligible residential & non-residential buildings located in moderate- to low-risk areas. For more information on flooding & insurance, visit https://www.floodsmart.gov.

Floodplain Development Permit Requirements: Build responsibly. OC Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction & structural repair work, & for any development within the Special Flood Hazard Area mapped on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps. The city reviews plans to be sure buildings are constructed to withstand flooding. Permits are also required before any land development (grading, filling, etc.) in the floodplain to ensure activities do not increase flooding potential on or around property. Part of the permit process involves preparation of elevation certificates, which provide a record of the structure's lowest floor elevation to predicted flood levels. Elevation certificates are maintained for

review by insurance agents, property owners & other interested persons. Obtain information & permits from Department of Planning & Community Development at City Hall 410.289.8855, jmetzgar@oceancitymd.gov. Illegal floodplain activity can also be reported here. Learn the Substantial Improvements rules by contacting the Building Office.

Drainage System Maintenance: It is important our drainage system be kept clear of obstructions & debris. The Town's littering ordinance prohibits throwing trash onto any public property, including storm drains & sewers. To report violations & clogged drainage ways, call 410.524.7716. Report any dumping of wastes you witness to the Environmental Engineer by calling 410.289.8825. Learn more at: https://oceancitymd.gov/oc/departments/engineering/environment/pollution-prevention-plan/.

Flood Protection Assistance: The Dept. of Planning & Community Development & City Engineer can assist with questions about flood protection & flood insurance, including historical flooding information so you can relate flood potential to your property; site visits to advise appropriate flood protection techniques; review retrofitting plans; locate property on flood insurance rate maps to determine flood zones & research elevation certificates for existing buildings to determine height above floodwaters. For more info, call 410.289.8855 or email imetzgar@oceancitymd.gov.

Property Protection Measures: There are many ways to protect property from flood damage. Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc. There are also ways to retrofit existing buildings to increase protection:

ELEVATION: Raising structure to bring it above floodwater level.

LEVEES: In areas of shallow flooding with low velocity, a levee can be built around the structure.

FLOOD WALLS: Similar to levees, but built of materials such as masonry block or reinforced concrete to keep flood water away.

CLOSURES: Involve techniques for protecting gaps left open for daily convenience, such as walks, doors, driveways. **SEALANTS:** Can be applied to walls & floors to keep water from penetrating.

UTILITY PROTECTION: Flooding sometimes causes costly damage to utility systems. By elevating utilities or shielding them, flooding can be avoided. Moving utilities to less flood-prone locations can also minimize damage. This article is published in each edition of the newsletter as required by the Town's participation in FEMA's Community Rating System. Property owners in Ocean City <u>may</u> receive a 20% discount on flood insurance premiums through this program. For an expanded version of this article, visit: <u>oceancitymd.gov.</u>.
