Mayor and City Council Oppose Offshore Wind Project

Ocean City Mayor and The City Council are continuing their opposition to the construction of offshore wind turbines within view of our shoreline. Unfortunately, despite our efforts, the turbines have only grown larger and closer to our beach. US Wind, the developer of the Maryland project has submitted permit applications to the Federal be allowed to construct turbines 938' tall as close as 11.5 miles from us. To put that in perspective, each turbine would be almost four times the height of the tallest building in Ocean City.

Not only has the size of the turbines increased but the impact on your electric bill could also be

bigger. Offshore wind is already one of the most expensive forms of electricity and a new law currently under consideration by the Maryland General Assembly would allow US Wind to renegotiate their agreements with the State to increase the subsidies they receive from Maryland Ratepayers. It is no wonder that US Wind needs more money from Maryland since they have been offering millions of dollars to for these Delaware towns agreeing not to oppose US Wind, they receive "Community Benefit Packages" from US Wind worth hundreds of thousands of dollars each year. US Wind made a similar offer to Ocean declined and Mayor Meehan stated that "Ocean City is not for sale".

A Beacon of Safety for Our Heroes

The independently ventilated turnout gear storage and multi-tier decontamination suite are integral components of the facility's design. Exposure to toxic chemicals and smoke can significantly increase the risk of developing cancer, and the Ocean City Fire Department recognizes this risk, striving to mitigate it with this innovative design.

By investing in this cutting-edge facility, the Ocean City community is making a clear statement - our firefighters' safety and health are of paramount importance. This new station sets a new standard for firefighter protection and represents a long-term commitment to those who protect our community.

A Look into the Future

Construction on the Midtown Fire Station 3 is already underway and is expected to be completed by late summer 2024. Museum of Ocean City to Complete Construction in Summer 2024

The Ocean City Museum Society is nearing completion of the old 1910 Bank of Ocean City building in downtown Ocean City on Dorchester Street.

The Ocean City Museum Society is striving to restore the building to its original glory by staying true to the 1910 architectural aesthetics. Specific architectural details that the society hopes to keep intact include the hardwood floors, crown molding, and the two safes that were installed in 1916 and 1947.

The Town of Ocean City and the Ocean City Museum Society have supported this ongoing project. The restoration of the 1910 Bank of Ocean City building is made possible through private and state grant funding. Grants have been awarded from the Department of Housing and Community Development, the Ocean City Development Corporation, and the Maryland Heritage Areas Program. The Museum of Ocean City will be an extension of the Ocean City Life-Saving Station Museum, providing additional space for new exhibits, programs and events, and research space for public use. The ultimate goal of the Museum of Ocean City is to preserve the building's historical identity while furthering the Ocean City Museum

Society's mission of inspiring and supporting the interpretation and appreciation of Worcester County cultural & natural history.



Henry Hotel Foundation Tells the Story of the Henry Hotel

The Henry Hotel located at the corner of S. Division Street and Baltimore Avenue is the last standing minorityowned hotel in Ocean City.

The Henry Hotel withstood the hurricane

of 1933 that cut the inlet, and the five-day nor'easter that nearly flattened Ocean City. It was built in 1916 and is less than 1,000 feet from the inlet. The north-south wing of the property was built later in the 1930's. The property was sold to Berlin residents Charles and Louisa Henry who turned it into the Henry Hotel serving African-American resort employees.

Upon the death Mr. Henry Sr. in 1942, the property went to his widow and two sons. In 1953, they sold the Henry Hotel to Joseph and Effie Weatherly. Mr. Weatherly's reputation was not endeared to many due to his involvement in somewhat 'dastardly' enterprises. Sadly, Mr. Henry was involved in these endeavors.

Mrs. Pearl Bonner was hired to manage the hotel around 1956. In 1964, she entered into a lease-to-buy agreement with the owners. She finally took ownership in 1973.

The Henry Hotel Foundation 501(c)3 was established in 2023. It is now our turn to help tell the story of the Henry Hotel. Visit our website at **www.henryhotel.org** to find out more information.

Little Salisbury Park Improvements

Little Salisbury Park at 94th Street will boast some welcome improvements in Spring of 2024.

A new vibrant, modular play structure, appropriately named the Aventus Tower, will replace the existing 20-year-



old play equipment. The Tower will provide inclusive play elements as well as many challenging elements including a 12' slide and an internal climbing wall. Three new swing bays will host two belt swings and one Expression Swing, a multi-generational swing that allows an adult and child to interact face-to-face while swinging together. The play area will be closed approximately six to eight weeks during construction.

In addition, new doggie turf will be installed in the worn areas at the popular Dog Playground on the north end of the Little Salisbury complex. An additional 2,735 square feet of synthetic turf will be added onto the north end of the existing turf area to provide a more consistent, level area conducive to year- 'round use. The dog playground will be closed for approximately ten to fourteen days during installation.

Downtown Recreation Complex Opening Soon

The transformation of the Downtown Recreation Complex. A two-block swath of land between 3rd and 4th Street is progressing as scheduled, with the reshaping of the overall space, the expansion of the Ocean Bowl Skate Park, the construction of new basketball and tennis/pickleball mixeduse court(s), and the construction of two new playgrounds, one being fully inclusive. This development represents a significant step forward in our commitment to enhancing recreational opportunities in our community.

The revitalized park will bring beautiful, usable open green space to the downtown area, with a circular pathway looping around that space, perfect for walkers and loggers to enjoy. Two exciting playground spaces, one designed for active 5-12 year old children, and one "inclusive-play" space, designed to meet the activity and socialization needs of individuals of all ages and abilities, will flank the east side of the west block. A newly constructed tennis court with a four-pickleball-court-overlav will provide active play opportunities as will the newly constructed basketball courts. The historic Ocean Bowl Skate Park gets its long-awaited expansion, answering the call for more street elements and an identifiable beginner's area to help introduce and welcome new skaters to the sport. "Tearing down fences". both physically and metaphorically, the newly imagined space will provide a more welcoming feel to all and will connect our community and our visitors to opportunities for better health. wellness. and fun.

You will receive an alert if your time is about to expire so you can add more time to your parking session through the app. It will even store your data for future use.

Rather pay at a kiosk?

No problem. All kiosks accept dollar bills and credit cards and a few specially-marked kiosks accept quarters as well. Before you leave your vehicle, write down or take a snapshot of your license plate number, estimate your length of stay, then head for the nearest kiosk. Please, take your time and follow the on-screen instructions and carefully enter the requested information. Inaccurate or incomplete data may result in additional charges and fines.

Want to extend your parking session?

OCEAN CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT Ordinance Reminders

The Ocean City Police Department is reminding residents and visitors that safety in our resort town is our number one priority. Our ordinances are designed to provide a pleasurable, safe & fun vacation, along with a livable community for our residents.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed in public. This includes any street, avenue, alley, sidewalk, Boardwalk, parking lot, on the beach or in any vehicle. Possessing an open container of any alcoholic beverage in public is prohibited.

Bikes, Skateboards, & Electric Bikes on the Boardwalk: Bikes, skateboards, & class 1 electric bikes are permitted on the Boardwalk from Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend - Labor Day, between 2 a.m. to 12 p.m. Class 2 & 3 electric bikes and hoverboards are not allowed on the Boardwalk at any time.

Fresh Air, Clean Beach: To help keep our beaches clean & our air fresh, OC is proud to offer a smokefree Boardwalk and designated smoking areas on the beach. Designed to accommodate both smokers & non-smokers, OC's restricted smoking policy provides designated smoking areas on the beach; however, prohibits smoking & vaping on the Boardwalk & beach access ways, beach & dune crossings, parks & covered bus shelters. Voluntary compliance is expected; however, citations for violations may be issued by officers if necessary.

Pets on the Beach & Boardwalk: Pets are not permitted on the beach or Boardwalk May 1 - September 30.

Grilling & Open Fires: Grilling is prohibited on public property except at designated park grill locations leased for private usage. Open fires are prohibited on public property, except in limited beach locations with a permit from the Fire Marshal's Office. More information can be found at ocbonfires.com.

TOWN OF OCEAN CITY, MARYLAND **License Requirements**

RENTAL LICENSE: If you rent your property to anyone or advertise your property for rent, for any length of time, the law requires you to first obtain an annual Ocean City rental license, and an Ocean City noise control permit. Online rentals must also comply. Maintaining a positive resident and visitor experience is important to everyone. Compliance with the laws, ordinances and regulations within the Town of Ocean City and State of Maryland ensure safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units. Rental applications may be obtained at City Hall, on the website or by contacting 410.289.8833 (https://oceancitymd. gov/oc/departments/finance/ new-licenses/)

R-1 Zoning: Properties located within the R-1 single family residential zoning district must meet occupancy criteria limited to no more than 4 unrelated people. Please contact the Department of Planning and Community Development for a pre-season inspection of your property to confirm compliance with building and fire codes and to determine maximum occupancy permitted. 410.289.8855.

REMINDER: Properties that may be in violation of rental licenses or a safety, building or health code should be reported to the Ocean City Property Review and Enforcement Strategies for Safe-housing (P.R.E.S.S.) Committee at 410.289.8855. Also the "Key to Successful New Construction or Home Renovation Projects is to Call BEFORE You Start!" From big to small projects and property improvements (decks, sheds, floating docks and landscaping), the Department of Planning and Community Development is ready to provide information to get you started. BUSINESS LICENSE: The Town of Ocean City is an exciting place to do business, with its strong tourism, stunning location and family-friendly atmosphere. If you operate or plan on operating a business or providing a service within Ocean City's town limits, the law requires you to obtain a Town of Ocean City business license. 

OCEAN CITY FLOOD HAZARD PROTECTION | April is Maryland Flood Awareness Month

All property in Ocean City is in a flood hazard area & subject to flooding from the ocean, coastal bays & heavy rainfall. Minor flooding is not uncommon & major flooding happens occasionally. FEMA places properties in flood zones based on their chance of flooding. Property owners can find their property's flood hazard designation by contacting the Department of Planning & Community Development, 410.289.8855, bneville@oceancitymd.gov, or the City Engineer, 410.289.8790, pmauser@oceancitymd.gov.

Natural & Beneficial Functions of Floodplains: Floodplains in their natural state provide many beneficial functions. Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in OC are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking on them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function. Bayside, wetlands & other open spaces act as sponges, storing floodwaters before they reach upland areas. These natural areas are protected by Federal, State & Local regulations.

Flood Warning System: OC has developed a flood warning system as part of our Comprehensive Operations Plan. Since flooding here is caused by storms & hurricanes, the warning system is based on storm severity & location. Protect family from flooding hazards. Establish a family rendezvous location when the warning is issued.

Flood Insurance: Standard homeowners insurance policies do not cover losses due to flooding. OC participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, which makes federally backed flood insurance available to property owners. This insurance is required in many cases, such as when property is purchased with a federally backed mortgage. Property owners can insure buildings & contents against flood damage & renters can insure possessions. Condominiums should carry a flood insurance policy on the structure itself. Flood insurance is available to all property owners & renters. For more information on flooding & insurance, visit https://www.floodsmart.gov.

Floodplain Development Permit Requirements: Build responsibly. OC Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction & structural repair work, & for any development within the Special Flood Hazard Area mapped on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps. The city reviews plans to be sure buildings are constructed to withstand flooding. Permits are also required before any land development (grading, filling, etc.) in the floodplain to ensure activities do not increase flooding potential on or around property. Part of the permit process involves preparation of elevation certificates, which provide a record of the structure's lowest floor

elevation to predicted flood levels. Elevation certificates are maintained for review by insurance agents, property owners & other interested persons. Obtain information & permits from Department of Planning & Community Development at City Hall 410.289.8855, jmetzgar@oceancitymd.gov. Illegal floodplain activity can also be reported here. Learn the Substantial Improvements rules by contacting the Building Office.

Drainage System Maintenance: It is important our drainage system be kept clear of obstructions & debris. The Town's littering ordinance prohibits throwing trash onto any public property, including storm drains & sewers. To report violations & clogged drainage ways, call 410.524.7716. Report any dumping of wastes you witness to the Environmental Engineer by calling 410.289.8825. Learn more at: **oceancity.green.**

Flood Protection Assistance: The Dept. of Planning & Community Development & City Engineer can assist with questions about flood protection & flood insurance, including historical flooding information so you can relate flood potential to your property; site visits to advise appropriate flood protection techniques; review retrofitting plans; locate property on flood insurance rate maps to determine flood zones & research elevation certificates for existing buildings to determine height above floodwaters. For more info, call 410.289.8855 or email jmetzgar@oceancitymd.gov.

Property Protection Measures: There are many ways to protect property from flood damage. Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc. There are also ways to retrofit existing buildings to increase protection:

ELEVATION: Raising structure to bring it above floodwater level.

CLOSURES: Involve techniques for protecting gaps left open for daily convenience, such as walks, doors, driveways.

SEALANTS: Can be applied to walls & floors to keep water from penetrating. For more flood mitigation ideas, visit **ReduceFloodRick.org.**

UTILITY PROTECTION: Flooding sometimes causes costly damage to utility systems. By elevating utilities or shielding them, flooding can be avoided. Moving utilities to less flood-prone locations can also minimize damage. This article is published in each edition of the newsletter as required by the Town's participation in FEMA's Community Rating System. Property owners in Ocean City **may** receive a 20% discount on flood insurance premiums through this program. For an expanded version of this article, visit: **oceancitymd.gov**.


