Inlet Lot Parking Validation Process

Give yourself plenty of time to enter the required information (you must know your plate information) into the Pay by Plate Kiosk and to be on the inlet beach and ready for the start of your activity.

- Go to a Kiosk-hit the yellow button-put your tag number in, then the provided validation code for that day and activity.
- Make sure that you ask for the printed receipt which you need to keep.
- That receipt-will be needed to void any ticket that you *might* get.
- These validation codes are only good for a specific date, time and activity.

On June 10th I received a 17-year-old patient whom dove into the shallow ocean and c/o neck pain with numbness and tingling of both arms. The patient's mother notified beach patrol and EMS arrived shortly afterwards. The patient's symptoms had resolved but as per protocol c-collar and backboard were applied. The patient was excepted at AGH with symptoms resolved and a c/o pain 4/10. He was removed from the back board and c-collar remained until after x-rays. Patient was diagnosed with a C7 burst fracture and transferred by helicopter to John Hopkins PEDS ER for emergency surgery. It was the excellent care of beach patrol / Ocean City EMS following protocol that prevented spinal cord injury of this young man. I would like to thank all involved for the great care in preserving this young man's quality of life.

Mr. James was very impressed with her ability to deal with this situation while still maintaining her ability to focus on swimmer safety in the ocean.



The 2023 Ocean Safety Award is presented to the Ocean City Beach Patrol's "JrBP". This program has been exciting and inspiring prospective guards from its beginning in 1999 with its 1st (2) sessions, which doubled in 2000 in the 130th Street beach house. In 2001, it moved to the old headquarters complex downtown. Its popularity has grown the program to the present (10) session 4-day sessions and (6) one day sessions. The class is limited to 30 participants so each gets the appropriate access to the training professional. The "JrBP" was the brain-child of Sgt. Matt McGinnis and received an "innovative program" award from the State of Maryland in its inaugural year. Sgt. McGinnis put his ideas to work and with support of Lt. Ward Kovacs and Capt Butch Arbin set the program on its successful track. Per Lt. Kovacs, the "JrBP" is their best recruiting tool. Congratulations and much future success in surf rescue training.



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OCBP Question of the Week for The Worcester County Times

I have noticed the lifeguards enforcing rules on the beach. What are the rules as far as what you can and cannot do on the beach and how much authority does a lifeguard have to enforce those rules?

The Beach Patrol is responsible for maintaining a safe, secure, and enjoyable atmosphere on the beach and in the ocean. The surf rescue technician on the stand carries out this responsibility by informing the public and enforcing applicable rules, laws, and local ordinances. Basically, the Ocean City Beach Patrol regulates all beach activities. However, because the Beach Patrol is enforcing laws and ordinances, if we have individuals who refuse to obey the directives of a Beach Patrol employee, we may ask for assistance from the Police, which may result in an arrest and or fines.

Our newest law in its eighth year this season is the Town of Ocean City's "Smoking Ordinance". Although it was passed into Law in May 2015, the Beach Patrol has included the request to use designated "Smoking Areas" for the past eight years. The new city ordinance is as follows: Smoking and vaping are unlawful on Atlantic Avenue (boardwalk) except within fifteen feet of a designated smoking area. Atlantic Avenue" means the areas of land designated and distinguished on the numerous plats of the Ocean Blocks of Ocean City, Maryland, which designate Atlantic Avenue, which is comprised of the beach, including the ramps placed thereon, the wooden railings, the boardwalk, including the concrete tram lane, the ramps extending westward and eastward from the boardwalk, decks extending eastward and westward from the boardwalk, the seawall, and tables and benches placed thereon, but excluding the inlet parking lot.

The SRT's will inform the public of this ordinance and if they notice someone violating the law they will tell the individual, so please follow the law so the SRTs are not leaving their primary responsibility to ask adults to follow the laws which in most cases they are already aware of. For your protection and safety, the activities below are either **Prohibited** Ø or **Regulated R** on the beaches of Ocean City.

- Ø Consuming alcoholic beverages (24 hours a day all year long including the boardwalk and all other public areas of the Town, regardless of the container).
- Ø Allowing dogs on the beach (May 1 – Sept 30) (24 hours a day including the boardwalk).
- Ø Sleeping on beach (10 p.m. – 6 a.m.).
- Ø Using a skim board after 10 a.m. and before 5:30 p.m.
- Ø Bringing glass containers onto the beach.
- R Starting open fires on the beach. (Never allowed during the day and bonfires at night with a permit)
- R Playing loud music.
- R Smoking and Vaping (must use designated areas at back of the beach)

These activities are under the discretion of the beach patrol:

- BP Ball playing and Frisbee throwing (never in front of guard stands).
- BP Umbrella placement beyond established line (never in front of guard stands).
- BP Kite flying. (Kites that are diving or crashing must be removed)
- BP Digging holes in the sand (never deeper than knee deep).
- BP Fishing while OCBP is on duty.
- BP Surfing in designated areas only. (Daily location is published on our website)

Our guards are prepared and eager to fulfill our three-part mission: education, prevention and intervention. This mission guides our organization.

We would like to suggest that you always follow these safety tips:

- Parents should monitor all activities of children they are responsible for to make sure they always remain safe and don't become lost. An important hint is to make sure all adults in your group communicate who is watching the children at any time.
- Apply sunscreen liberally and often.
- Drink plenty of water.
- Have required medications with you in case they are needed
- Wear eye protection.
- Have footwear because the sand can cause serious burns (especially for children)
- Establish and check landmarks.
- Keep valuables off the beach.
- Please put trash in its place (Leave only your footprints).
- No glass containers please.
- And finally, take seriously the warning of the SRT when storms are in the area. The Ocean City Beach Patrol is in constant communication with the National Weather Service. When instructed by beach patrol personnel, please secure your belongings, and leave the beach immediately for your safety and ours!

If you have a question, please ask. If you see an inappropriate or unsafe situation, please bring it to the attention of the SRT. To get current information about the beach patrol as well as daily stats and current beach conditions, you can follow the beach patrol on, Instagram or "like us" on the Official OCBP Facebook page. If interested in exciting, meaningful work as part of the Beach Patrol talk to your Surf Rescue Technician (lifeguard) or visit our website JoinBeachPatrol.com. We can't wait to be a part of your wonderful experiences in Ocean City, because we are glad you are here, and remember our saying: "Keep Your Feet in the Sand until the Lifeguard's in the Stand." This is a reminder to never go in the ocean when the Beach Patrol is not on duty. As added protection for you and your friends, always locate the nearest stand with a guard and swim on that beach.



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Meet the Lifeguard: ACC Michael Young

Assistant Crew Chief (ACC) Michael Young has been with the Beach Patrol for 3 years, although like many of our SRTs, Michael began his association with the Patrol while participating in the Junior Beach Patrol program. Because of his success in JBP he was able to pass the Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluation and attend Surf Rescue Academy at age 16 (1 year earlier than non JBP participants). He is the ACC of Crew 15 and sits the stand in the north area on 120th street. The ACC is a one season leadership training position and requires the SRT to attend specialized trainings, before being appointed. Michael likes to run cross country and track for is high school competing at the state competition for the past three years. He plays lacrosse for his high school winning regional titles 3 times and competing at state finals. He also likes to skate, surf, and play instruments. In the off season he will be attending Salisbury University for a degree in Secondary Education.

ACC Michael Young and the other lifeguards of the Ocean City Beach Patrol are glad to answer any of your beach and water safety questions. If you think you would like a position with the Patrol like Michael, ask any of our Surf Rescue Technicians or visit our website at JoinBeachPatrol.com. We will start testing for next summer this August. We pay (\$18.44 / 2023 rate) while we train you in our Surf Rescue Training Academy where all certifications will be provided. It's never too late to join our team.
