

Seasonal Rental Housing Stipend

This is a \$250.00 stipend to off-set the cost of relocating and renting seasonal housing to work for the Beach Patrol. To qualify and receive the stipend you must meet the following criteria. The stipend will be paid once all obligations have been taken care of.

- 1. You must provide a copy of your seasonal lease with your name on it. It must include the specific dates of the lease, the amount of rent and the location of the property.
- 2. You must submit the "Seasonal Rental Housing Stipend" form with the lease attached.
- 3. You must complete the season as you agreed to and have worked a minimum of 400.0 hours.
- 4. You must have no monetary obligations to the Town or the Beach Patrol (equipment, ocbpsra purchases, entry fees, etc).

Message

The lifeguard on duty today between the Capri and the Irene (the chalkboard said his name is Jake) was absolutely wonderful. He was super aware of his surroundings and was proactive about letting folks know when the waves were unsafe for boogie boarding and body surfing. He approached people about it very respectfully and professionally. Very impressive!



Why do the lifeguards make people leave the beach when it is just thundering or a little bit of lightning?

The Ocean City Beach Patrol is in constant contact with the weather service and is always aware of the current weather situation. Recent developments in lightning detection and monitoring technologies give us more accurate and timely information on potentially dangerous developing cloud to ground lightning and we use this information to help assure you and your family's safety. With the launch of NOAA's most advanced weather satellites ever developed (GOES-R and GOES-S), in recent years, real-time lightning detection is more accurate and readily available than ever and will assist us in providing early warning of these deadly events. According to the National Weather Service, a long-term average of 43 people die from lightning strikes each year in the United States and hundreds more are injured, but that number has been continuing to trend downward thanks in part to increased awareness, safety campaigns, and growing accessibility of weather forecasts and warnings. Other important facts indicate that of all fatalities most occur in July and on the beach or near water.

Many times, weather conditions vary from one end of Ocean City to the other. It can be sunny and mild in the south by the boardwalk and lightening and showers just 9 miles north. In fact, there are many documented cases throughout the country of people being hit by lightning while the sun is shining (called a bolt from the blue). This phenomenon was recently featured on the Weather Channel and is far more common than previously thought. In fact, the National Weather Service has changed the recorded warnings that are transmitted on the Weather radio system when there is a threat of thunderstorms, to say "If you hear thunder, then you are close enough to be struck by lightning"!

The Beach Patrol is not only in constant contact with the weather service, but they have constant communication with each other up and down the beach as well. The Beach Patrol, like other modern emergency services, relies on two-way radio systems. However, they still use two systems that do not rely on any technology: whistle blasts and semaphore. The Beach Patrol's primary concern is your safety and will clear the beaches if it is not safe. There have been at least 10 documented cases of people who have been struck by lightning while on the beach (not in the water) in Ocean City with several resulting in death. While vacationing on the beaches in OC you may or may not notice the lifeguards communicating with each other, but please heed their warnings and leave the beach if asked to do so even if you do not see lightening. By complying with the directive of your Surf Rescue Technician to leave the beach immediately, you not only protect yourself but also allow our personnel to take safe cover without being delayed while trying to convince adults that it is unsafe to remain on the beach. We have had our own personnel struck by lightning and we need to keep them safe as well. With the constant monitoring of the weather and communication systems, your Surf Rescue Technician will be aware of dangers that you might not be able to see. A beach is listed as one of the most vulnerable places to be during an electrical storm, according to weather researchers. Just remember for your safety... "If thunder roars, GO indoors!" To get current information about the beach patrol as well as daily stats and current beach conditions, you can follow the beach patrol on Instagram or "like us" on the Official OCBP Facebook page. We can't wait to be a part of your wonderful experiences in Ocean City, because we are glad you are here, and always remember to "Keep your feet in the sand until the lifeguard's in the stand!" As added protection for you and your friends, always locate the nearest stand with a guard and swim on that beach.

SRT Tom Powell has been with the Beach Patrol for 4 years. He is a member of Crew 3 and sits the stand on 10th street. Tom is a United States Life Saving Association (USLA) member and a member of our competition team. In his free time, he likes to work on cars and ride motorcycles. He just graduated from West Chester University with a Bachelor's of Science in Criminal Justice. While a student at West Chester he was a member of the swim team and is the Beach Patrol's fastest distance swimmer and just won the Captain Craig mile swim race for the second year in a row.
