


Participants receive an official OCBP t-shirt, whistle, and sunscreen.

We expect every employee to fulfill their employment agreement.

Between seasons, we are often asked to complete references and recommendations. If the need for this arises, we ask that you make the request in writing. In that request, you should give any information that will help in creating the best possible recommendation. We will also need to know to whom it goes and if there is a particular format or form that is required. It will also be helpful to remind us of some of the Beach Patrol activities that you have been involved in; JBP, Camps, special duties, etc. We will need a fair amount of lead-time since personnel files are secured at HQ while we are away from Ocean City. OCBP Question-of-the-Week for The Worcester County Times

I heard a lifeguard telling a friend that the OCBP has already started to test for lifeguards for next summer (2024). Why are you testing now for next year? When are these tests being held? What does "testing" mean and what certifications do I need? They also said you were offering a \$500 signing Bonus.

Because of the unique demands of the job, the Beach Patrol does not require or recognize certification or past experience with other agencies. All individuals seeking employment with the Ocean City Beach Patrol must present some form of Identification and pass an "English Proficiency" aptitude conversation. Following an orientation talk each candidate must **demonstrate the capacity to complete** a 300m soft sand sprint in 65 seconds or less on the beach and complete a 400m ocean swim in 10 minutes or less. Once they pass the run and the swim **candidates receive instruction**, are provided the opportunity to practice, and then they are evaluated on the following skills:

- Complete a buoy preparation training session and practice surf entry with a rescue buoy.
- Complete a series of simulated rescues with a rescue buoy.
- Complete a series of simulated rescues without the aid of a rescue buoy.
- Complete a victim transport training session and victim removal assessment.
- Complete a tower transport training session and a tower transport assessment.
- Complete a 125m running sprint with rescue buoy in at least 25sec (off-site).
- Complete a rescue medley of 150m run, 100m swim through the surf and 150m return run (on-site).
- Complete a deep-water physical skill evaluation of holds and releases.

These physical skill requirements make up the 10-phase pre-employment physical skills evaluation (PEPSE). Testing for the OCBP is offered in Ocean City and at select off-site locations during our off-season if needed. Once a candidate passes the physical skills test and a personal interview, he/she is appointed to a paid (\$18.44 2023 rate) Surf Rescue Training Academy. We hold two Surf Rescue Training Academies each season to accommodate individual needs the first begins on Sunday, May 19, 2024 with a second academy beginning Sunday, June 16th. After passing a mandatory drug test, Surf Rescue Academy is an eight (8) consecutive day \$18.44/hour training program comprised of both physical skill training and development as well as classroom-based trainings, certifications and "On the Job Training". Following the successful completion of Surf Rescue Academy, rookie Surf Rescue Technicians are assigned 3 weeks of on the stand supervised probation in a crew to continue instruction in all aspects of surf rescue and first responder skills, with a written review each week. Once the probationary period is completed the rookie will be recognized as a Surf Rescue Technician and receive an incentive award.

We have 3 Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluations (testing) scheduled this August starting on Wednesday, August 9th. The final 2 tests are on the next Saturday's, August 12th and 19th Ocean City. If you are interested, please register on-line and check-in beginning at 9 A.M. at Dorchester Street on the Boardwalk. So that we may assist with housing and obtaining a J-1 visa if needed, try-out as soon as possible.

The reason we begin testing now is to take advantage of the great ocean conditions (warmer water) while recruiting those individuals who have spent a summer living and working in Ocean City. Some people do not consider trying out because they are under a misconception that they do not have the necessary credentials to seek employment as an ocean lifeguard. These tests are a great opportunity for our visiting J-1 students to secure a job with the patrol for next summer. As seasonal workers and visitors have met Surf Rescue Technicians who are currently working for us over the summer, they come to realize that we provide paid training and certifications in Surf Rescue Academy. Working as a Surf Rescue Technician is a possibility for them to have a job of significance that makes a real difference. Each candidate is required to pass all phases of the Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluation which includes a personal interview and receive a recommendation from the evaluation team to receive an appointment to a Surf Rescue Training Academy. These potential recruits have already spent one summer in Ocean City and are familiar with the area and have already solved the problem of securing seasonal housing, although we do have some limited employee housing, we also have a housing referral program. Therefore, when they accept an appointment to a Surf Rescue Academy, they are most likely to follow through and actually accept the position the following season (we lose a few recruits each year to personal logistical concerns).

A major reason that we also start testing a year ahead is that we want to have the opportunity to attract and hire the best. With a national lifeguard shortage, we work year-round to assure that we have 100% of our positions filled each year, while many other local governments and beach patrols have to close pools, close beaches or reduce coverage.

We encourage anyone interested in becoming a Surf Rescue Technician (lifeguard) to speak to the lifeguard on your beach, go to our website or contact Beach Patrol Head Quarters (410- 289-7556) and register for a specific testing opportunity. Meet the Lifeguard: ACC Harrison Duncan

Assistant Crew Chief (ACC) Harrison Duncan has been with the Beach Patrol for 2 years, although like many of our SRTs, Harrison began his association with the Patrol while participating in the Junior Beach Patrol program. Because of his success in JBP he was able to pass the Pre-Employment Physical Skills Evaluation and attend Surf Rescue Academy at age 16 (1 year earlier than non JBP participants).

He is the ACC of Crew 12 and sits the stand on 86th street. The ACC is a one season leadership training position and requires the SRT to attend specialized training, before being appointed. In his spare time, he likes to surf, swim and workout. In the off season he will begin his freshman year at Towson University, and he is also a lifeguard at the Salisbury YMCA when not in school. Additionally, Harrison is a 2nd generation lifeguard, and he is only the 2nd SRT to have a mother who was one of the first women to join the patrol. ACC Harrison Duncan and the other lifeguards of the Ocean City Beach Patrol are glad to answer any of your beach and water safety questions. If you think you would like a position with the Patrol like Harrison, ask any of our Surf Rescue Technicians or visit our website at JoinBeachPatrol.com. We well start testing for next summer this August and provide a \$500 signing bonus. We pay (\$18.44 / 2023 rate) while we train you in our Surf Rescue Training Academy where all certifications will be provided. It's never too late to join our team.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

As part of it's mission to support the Ocean City Beach Patrol and the guards who serve, the OCBP Alumni Association announces it's Fourth Annual Scholarship Challenge. The prize: a one time \$500 College Scholarship award to a current OCBP SRT.

Who is eligible?

The Challenge is open to any current OCBP SRT in good standing, who is enrolled in or entering a 2 or 4 year college in the Fall of 2023. Applicants must be registered for classes.

What is the Challenge?

A 500 word essay on the topic: "What is the most valuable lesson you will take from your time on the OCBP?" (450 minimum / 550 maximum.)

How do you submit your essay?

Essays are to be emailed as a .pdf file to Ward Kovacs (wkovacs@oceancitymd.gov). Do not include your name on you submission file. Instead, title your file using your birthday as the code. For instance, if you were born on July 4, 2005 you would title the file "07042005". This is meant to avoid favoritism. Make sure in your email that Ward knows who you are.

What are the judges looking for in an essay?

Your time on the OCBP has been a learning experience. What did you learn and how will you use it in life? Essays will be judged on ideas, presentation, grammar and spelling. Plagiarism will result in automatic disqualification.

What are the important dates to know for the challenge?

All submissions are due before midnight **August 9, 2023.** The winning essay will be announced **August 15, 2023.** The Scholarship prize will be issued immediately afterwards.
