### FRESH AIR. CLEAN BEACH.

After a successful and educational first summer season, the Town of Ocean City's restricted smoking policy will continue on the beach and Boardwalk. The ordinance, which took effect on May 1, 2015, prohibits smoking on the Boardwalk and provides designated smoking areas on the nearby beach. These areas are **SMOKE-FREE**:

- 1. Boardwalk & beach access ways
- 2. Beach & dune crossings
- 3. Parks & covered bus stop shelters

A copy of the ordinance in its entirety can be found at oceancitymd.gov. Voluntary compliance of the ordinance is expected, although Town of Ocean City code allows for issuance of citations for violations.

### Town Hires New City Manager

After a national search yielded dozens of applicants, the selection of the next city manager in Ocean City has been made. In a unanimous

vote, the Ocean City Council approved the hiring of Douglas Miller as the new city manager. Miller began his position with the town on February 8, coming to Ocean City from Aberdeen, Maryland, where he has held the position of City Manager since 2006. Serving municipalities in Maryland for the length of



his career, he also held town manager positions in La Plata and Snow Hill. A credentialed manager with the International City and County Management Association (ICMA), Miller has also served as president, vice president and secretary treasurer of the Maryland City and County Management Association, as well as several committees of the Maryland Municipal League. Miller has a master's degree in public administration from the University of Baltimore and is a firm believer in strategic planning, with strong knowledge of Maryland government.

Intending to use his prior experience and professional knowledge to return to where he started his municipal career, Miller's familiarity with Maryland government and experience in both tourism and emergency management made him a great candidate for the town's chief director.

### STORMY SIXTIES TAKE OVER LIFE-SAVING STATION MUSEUM

*A TREASURE ON THE BOARDWALK* – Experience the drama of shipwrecks and rescue and discover the colorful

past of our resort town by visiting The Ocean City Life-Saving Station Museum. Located on the southern start of Ocean City's worldfamous Boardwalk, overlooking the inlet, is a treasure trove of history. Built on Caroline Street in 1891 for the U.S. Life-Saving Service (predecessor of today's Coast Guard) this historic building was moved to its present location by the Town of Ocean City in partner-

ship with the non-profit Ocean City Museum Society in 1977 where it was carefully restored and dedicated as a museum the following year.

This season, the museum pays tribute to the decade of s "The Stormy Sixties" focusing on events, lifestyles and



growth of that tumultuous time. The 1960's was a decade of change for America and also a very memorable decade for Ocean City. Although only one man – Hugh T. Cropper, Jr. – presided as mayor during this time, the Town went through a lot of changes and development. There were riots, storms, cool fashions, condominiums and, as always, a whole lot of fun! In fact, the 1960 O.C. Bureau of Information touted

Ocean City as "The Hospitality Resort with Family Fun at Family Prices." Additionally, featured inside are diverse displays such as "Sands of the World" with over 200 sand

High-Capacity Buses Coming

OC Transportation is preparing for the 2016 tourist season by adding two high-capacity articulating buses to the resort's public transit fleet. Bus manufacturer New Flyer is in the process of building two Excelsior model XB60 sixty (60') diesel articulating buses for the Town. The ADA-compliant buses will seat 63 (31 standing) as compared to our standard 40' bus that seats 35 (18 standing). Funding for



the two buses comes from a combination of Federal and State grants along with a

Local match. The breakdown of the approximately \$1.4 million purchase is 80% Federal Transit Administration (FTA), 10% Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) and 10% Town of OC. The buses are scheduled to be completed in late April at New Flyer's Crookston, Minnesota facility with **delivery expected in May**. Upon receipt, driver training will be conducted, the artics will operationally be outfitted with radios, fare boxes, etc., and placed into service in time for the passenger "crush loads" of June. While the new buses will operate primarily during the height of the summer tourist season, they could also be deployed for special events including Springfest, Sunfest and the OC Air Show.

#### OC P.R.E.S.S. COMMITTEE TO HOST ANNUAL SEMINAR

The <u>Property Review and Enforcement Strategies</u> for <u>Safe-housing (P.R.E.S.S.)</u> Committee will host a reprise of last year's successful Housing Compliance and Regulations Update Seminar for landlords, real estate agents, rental property owners, foreign exchange student sponsors and student advisory groups. The meeting will address community-wide quality of life issues

that historically affect Ocean City during the summer including property issues and violations related to noise, sanitation, fire and life safety, overcrowding and building



code violations. Expectations of code compliance from various departments, including the police, building, zoning, fire marshal and finance departments will be explained. **This year's annual seminar will be held Tuesday, April 12, 9am–11am at the Roland E. #### **Comprehensive Plan Underway**

Employees of the Town of OC are busy making updates to the community-wide Comprehensive Plan and Hazard Mitigation Plan. The town's Planning & Zoning Commission is tasked with the responsibility for review and recommendation of changes to the community's Comprehensive Plan. The approved plan, dated August 2006, was updated in October 2009 but is currently due for a 'six year review." Review & discussion of Comprehensive Plan chapters is underway during regular meetings of the Planning and Zoning Commission, which occur at 6:30pm on the first and third Tuesday of each month at City Hall. The town is also working on an update to the 2011 All-Hazard Mitigation Plan. Mitigation Planning is to identify local policies and actions that can be implemented over the long term to reduce risk and future losses from hazards. These mitigation policies and actions are identified based on an assessment of hazards, vulnerabilities, risks and participation of a wide range of stakeholders and the public in the planning process. A planning team has been established which includes staff from multiple town departments. #### **Changes to Trailer Parking**

In an effort to improve traffic conditions and increase pedestrian safety, the Mayor and City Council worked closely with the Ocean City Police Department to expand the local ordinance pertaining to oversized vehicle and trailer parking. **Effective May 1, 2016**:

- NO TRAILER OR OVERSIZED VEHICLE PARKING ON BALTIMORE AVE. AT ANYTIME. (An oversized vehicle is any vehicle that is either over 21 feet, 2 inches in length and/or over 6 feet, 8 inches in width, or both.)
- No trailer or oversized vehicle parking on any street or public lot without a permit between May 1 and Oct. 31, except 100th Street Municipal Lot & West OC Park & Ride.
- Permits are available to registered participants of certain special events from event promoters including Cruisin' OC, OC Bikefest & Endless Summer Cruisin' for a fee of \$50.
- The new ordinance applies to trailers that are both attached and detached from vehicles.
- The fine for trailer & oversized vehicle violations is \$250.
- Scofflaws (3 or more outstanding tickets or \$100 or more in outstanding fines) may be booted or towed.

Violators are subject to a \$250 fine and impoundment. For more information, visit oceancitymd.gov.

#### Important! Election Day Info

With Election Day quickly approaching, the Town of Ocean City is reminding citizens that the municipal election, held on November 8, 2016, will coincide with National Election Day. The polls, held at the Roland E. Powell Convention Center, open promptly at 7am and close at 8pm. **Residents unable to go to the polls on Election Day must apply for an absentee ballot in** writing by October 28, 2016, to allow plenty of time to receive, complete and deliver the ballots.

Ocean City residents should also be mindful that early voting centers will <u>NOT</u> include the municipal election on the early voting ballot. To vote for the municipal election, voters must either vote in person at the Roland E. Powell Convention Center or by absentee ballot.

Residents who have not yet registered to vote but wish to do so must register on or before **October 18, 2016**. If you reside within the corporate limits of Ocean City and wish to register to vote, you may fill out a form obtained at City Hall, the local post office, Northside Park and the Public Safety Building or call the Worcester County Election Board Office at 410.632.1320. The completed form can be mailed back to the county election board using the address provided. For those

residents who wish to run for city office, the last day to file for candidacy is October 11, 2016. Candidates may submit their applications to the City Clerk's Office. For more information about the town of Ocean City municipal election, please contact the City Clerk's Office at 410.289.8824.

Residents unable to go to the polls on Election Day must apply for an absentee ballot in writing by October 28, 2016, to allow plenty of time to receive, complete and deliver the ballots. Absentee ballots must be <i>received</i> by the City Clerk's Office by mail or hand no later than November 7, 2016 at 5pm. Absentee voters should be mindful that the process, when done by mail, takes time. Therefore, voters are encouraged to allow plenty of time to receive, complete and deliver their ballots. Residents should also be mindful that early voting centers will NOT include the municipal election on the early voting ballot. To vote for the municipal election, voters must either vote in person at the Roland E. Powell Convention Center or by absentee ballot. #### New Electric Car & Tesla Charging Stations Installed

Electric car owners and enthusiasts can now charge their vehicle in OC, attracting a new group of visitors and residents in town. Discussions to add the charging stations began in April 2015, when the Council welcomed the Tesla Road Trip Reach the Beach Event. Following the event, the Mayor and Council approved participation in the "Tesla Destination



Grant Program" enabling the Town to install 2 Tesla-specific charging stations and one universal charging station at the northeast corner of the Convention Center. In late fall 2015, a second organization, the Electric Vehicle Institute (EVI), offered to donate 3 additional

universal dual-vehicle charging stations. The Mayor and Council approved the installation of one dual station at the 3rd street athletic fields, one dual EVI charging station at 100th Street and one dual-EVI charging station at Northside Park. Over the next year, the town will evaluate the cost of the existing sites and potentially add more locations for the south end of Town.

#### Town Officials Stress Safety On Balconies, Decks & Guardrails

With notable incidents involving balcony tragedies reaching from the OC community to communities

across the country, the Town of OC is urging all owners of residential and commercial structures to follow the safety inspection checklist. Taking time to inspect all balconies, decks, guardrails, and stairs for potential safety hazards can prevent a catastrophe before it occurs. According to OC Chief Building Officer, Kevin Brown, poor maintenance is the number one reason for structure failure. "All visitors that come to Ocean City to enjoy our wonderful town should be aware of balcony overloading," Brown commented. "Too many people standing on a balcony at one time [overcrowding] can place an enormous amount of stress on the structural members and may result in a major collapse of the balcony and possible serious injury or even death." The building department urges residents and visitors to use caution when allowing children on a balcony, encouraging supervision of children on balconies, fire escapes and high porches at all times. Also, furniture and other items should be moved away from the balcony and deck railings to prevent children from climbing. "Proper inspections from a qualified engineer or contractor can help prevent hazards associated with deck collapse and hazards from a guardrail failure just to name a few," Brown concluded. In addition, the town's public safety departments encourage citizens to put safety first when spending time on balconies. At no point should you, or anyone, sit on, stand on, walk on or lean over a balcony. Listed below is a simple inspection checklist that will help in evaluating balconies or decks:

#### DECK OR BALCONY:

- · Split or rotting wood
- Deteriorated fasteners, screws, nails, bolts, etc.
- Poor end support of balcony deck, joist or girders
- Excessive movement of balcony or deck
- Swaying or unstable
- Loose, missing or rusted anchors, joist hangers, nails or screws
- Damaged or decayed support beams, posts or decking
- Inspect connection to building or structure

#### **GUARDRAILS & STAIRS:**

- Missing, deteriorated or loose railing, ornamental pickets, top & bottom rails
- Rusted or deteriorated fasteners, screws, bolts, nails etc.
- Wobbly handrails or guardrails
- Loose or deteriorated guardrail support post
- Level & secure landings both top & bottom of all stairs
- Deteriorated, loose or uneven treads
- Tread nosing cracked or badly wornNails protruding from lumber

The OC Building Dept. encourages citizens who believe their deck is unsafe or in need of repair, to please contact the Office of Building Inspection at 410.289.8855 or call a qualified licensed general contractor for further evaluation and repairs.

Natural & Beneficial Functions of Flood**plains:** Floodplains in their natural state provide many beneficial functions. Primary undeveloped flood plain areas in OC are beaches & dunes, the first line of defense against flood damage from the ocean. Taking care of dunes by not walking on them & maintaining vegetation is essential to retaining their flood protection function. Bayside, wetlands & other open spaces act as sponges, storing floodwaters before they reach upland areas. These natural areas are protected by Federal, State & Local regulations.

Flood Warning System: OC has developed a flood warning system as part of our Comprehensive Operations Plan. Since flooding here is caused by storms & hurricanes, the warning system is based on storm severity & location. Protect family from flooding hazards. Establish a family rendezvous location when the warning is issued.

OC participates in the National Flood Insurance Property Protection Measures: There are Program, which makes federally backed flood insurance available to property owners. This insurance is required in many cases, such as when property is purchased with a federally backed mortgage. Property owners can insure buildings & contents against flood damage & renters can insure possessions. Condominiums should carry a flood insurance policy on the structure itself. Flood insurance is available to all property owners & renters. Consider a Preferred Risk Flood Insurance Policy. The NFIP's Preferred Risk Policy, or PRP, offers low-cost flood insurance to owners & tenants of eligible residential & non-residential buildings located in moderate- to low-risk areas. #### Floodplain Development Permit

Requirements: Build responsibly. OC Code requires a building permit be obtained for nearly all construction & structural repair work, & for any development within the Special Flood Hazard Area mapped on the Flood Insurance Rate Maps. The city reviews plans to be sure buildings are constructed to withstand flooding. Permits are also required before any land development (grading, filling, etc.) in the floodplain to ensure activities do not increase flooding potential on or around property. Part of the permit process involves preparation of elevation certificates, which provide a record of the structure's lowest floor elevation to predicted flood levels. Elevation certificates are

> many ways to protect property from flood damage. Make sure your new building is constructed to meet or exceed code requirements. These include requirements for elevation of building, foundations, venting, etc. There are also ways to retrofit existing buildings to increase protection:

> **ELEVATION:** Raising structure to bring it above floodwater level.

LEVEES: In areas of shallow flooding with low velocity, a levee can be built around the structure. FLOOD WALLS: Similar to levees, but built of materials such as masonry block or reinforced concrete to keep flood water away.

**CLOSURES:** Involve techniques for protecting gaps left open for daily convenience, such as walks, doors, driveways.

SEALANTS: Can be applied to walls & floors to keep water from penetrating

UTILITY PROTECTION: Flooding sometimes causes costly damage to utility systems. By elevating utilities or shielding them, flooding can be avoided. Moving utilities to less flood-prone locations can also minimize damage.

#### **FEMA'S Flood Insurance Rate Maps**

FEMA's new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) are effective, since July 2015, for the town of Ocean City. As a result of the revised flood maps, new flood zones and new flood rates will apply to flood insurance policies. While many Ocean City properties will experience insur-ance premium relief, it's important to remember that OC is a barrier island, subject to severe storms and flooding. Although your lender bank may no longer require you to have flood insurance, based on FEMA's FIRM map changes, approximately 30% of all flooding in the U.S. occurs in moderate to low risk flood zones. Further, studies show many properties without flood insurance typically are not rebuilt after a flood disaster. For more details about your flood insurance policy and the forthcoming changes, please contact your insurance provider and/or an experienced insurance professional that is well versed in flood insurance. Flood Insurance is encouraged.

#### **Rental Licenses:**

If you rent your property to **anyone at any time**, the law requires you to obtain an annual Ocean City rental license AND an Ocean City noise control permit. This is to maintain the character of single family residential districts and to assure compliance with all laws, ordinances and regulations, while also ensuring safe, healthy and habitable housing conditions in rental housing units. Rental applications may be obtained at City Hall or by contacting 410.289.8833. Properties that may be in violation of rental license or a safety, building or health code should be reported to the Ocean City Property <u>Review and Enforcement Strategies for Safe-housing</u> (P.R.E.S.S) Committee at 410.289.8855.

The Town of Ocean City is an exciting place to do business with its strong tourism, stunning location and family-friendly atmosphere.
